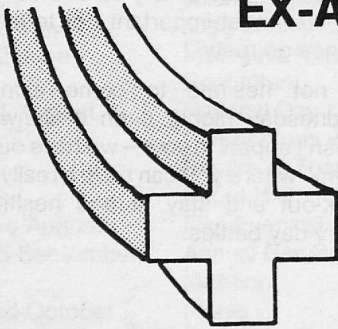

Since February 3, 1981 the Swiss community is officially represented on the ethnic broadcasting schedule offered by the Radiostation 6NR operated by the West Australian Institute of Technology. Louis Jacomelli and Philippe Muehlethaler formerly assisting the Swiss Radio Programme on 3EA in Melbourne, are in charge of the preparation and presentation of those ½-hourly weekly programs, which can be heard each Tuesday between 12 noon and 12.30 on the frequency 927 Mhz. (AM transmissions). The first Swiss programs have been quite successful and have earned praise from both Swiss and non-Swiss listeners and it is hoped that the forthcoming increase in transmitting power of 6NR will definitely improve the reception of those programs.
