
Switzerland in fifty years

Essay and poster

Your work should be in the form of an essay between 5 and 10 pages long on separate A4 sheets. It should be accompanied by a poster with the following dimensions: 970 mm wide x 1,376 mm high. This should be a concise and expressive summary of your work. Naturally you may depict your ideas in any way you choose. Drawings, texts, charts are all possibilities.

The prize: a trip to Switzerland

The competition is open to all Swiss Abroad between 15 and 20. Your contribution will be judged by a jury selected by the Science and Youth Foundation. This will be made up of eminent figures from science and the humanities. The writers of the ten best entries will be rewarded with a free trip to Switzerland enabling them to take part in the Neuchâtel Congress of the Swiss Abroad. A special programme of activities will be prepared for them during their stay in Switzerland. **Encouraging youth** to undertake research is the aim of "Science and Youth". An example is Samuel Schär who won the European Union's contest for young scientists in 1994 with a self-built plasma accelerator. The "Switzerland in 2050" competition presented on this page should inspire young Swiss Abroad to undertake research.
