CSA. Spring Session

Report on the meeting of the Council Of The Swiss Abroad in Berne, 27 March 2010

New legislation for the Swiss Abroad: The Swiss Secretariat is heavily involved in discussing and preparing legislation concerning the Swiss Abroad. It is very comprehensive and is currently under review and preparation by various working groups. The items which gave most rise to discussions was the way the new legislation provides that future delegates of the Swiss Abroad to the Swiss Council are elected. The working group suggestion is that, only those Swiss Abroad who are registered to vote in Switzerland can elect delegates, not any more the registered Swiss Clubs. I was one of only a few to object to that method because it eliminates the influence and the hard work the Swiss Clubs have done in the past. I think it would be a different matter if the delegates from abroad are elected to the Swiss

Parliament, but it is another thing if the delegates are only members of the current Council. No doubt this will continue to be debated. This method of selecting and electing delegates to the Council needs to be further discussed and thought through.

Subsidy for www.swissinfo.ch The Swiss Federal Council has indicated its intention to cut totally the subsidy for the website www.swissinfo.ch by 2012. Strong debate, everyone urged the Council to make strong representation in order to keep the subsidy, also a resolution was passed. The representative of the Federal Government did say that he didn't think that a final decision in this regard had been made and therefore the matter is still pending and under consideration.

Please say no to budget cuts and participate in the online-petition:

Electronic voting: e-voting for the Swiss Abroad is getting closer, at least in some cantons. After Neuenburg, Geneva should get its act together for 2011 and for Zurich the Swiss from Abroad should be able to vote still this year electronically.

Peak Organisations: I also took part in a specially arranged meeting the day before the official meeting, which was convened especially by our friends from Germany and France to discuss the advantages of having peak organisations of all Swiss Clubs in their country [which we did not think useful here in Australia]. Nevertheless, the discussion and experience was quite interesting. The main advantages seem to be: receipt of official information from Swiss authorities and dissemination to all clubs in all regions which

seems to be working well. They stress also that the flow of information is better quaranteed and quite easy. They also claim that if a Swiss from anywhere wants to have some contacts anywhere in Germany they can help more easily. A peak organisation also takes on some representative functions.

Congress of the Swiss Abroad: It will be held from 20th to 22nd August, 2010 in St. Gallen. Marc Godat will keep you up to date in

the next issue.

Please also note, in order to have a say on all matters Swiss, do register to vote in Switzerland and contact your nearest Swiss Consulate. Swiss Abroad should be heard and they can make a difference.

CSA. No to the Dismantling of Information Services

After the Swiss Review was reduced from 6 to 4 editions in 2009, the federal government announced on 25 February 2010 that it intends to discontinue its financial contribution to swissinfo as part of its budget program for 2011-2013. This would almost certainly mean that without the government subsidy, the Swiss Broadcasting Cooperation would also withdraw its financial support immediately, which would spell the certain end of the multimedia news and information platform swissinfo. Jacques-Simon Eggly posed the question which communication strategy Switzerland is perusing with regards to openness to the world and its connection to Swiss citizens world-wide: "It cannot be that our country is withdrawing from the rest of the world" he said, and adding: "The axing of swissinfo must be averted. It is in the hands of the parliament to prevent this from happening. The proposed budget program cannot be adopted if the members of the federal councils refuse to change the Radio and Telecommunication law." He appealed to the councillors to say 'no' to these budget cuts and reminded them of the government's obligation to serve as an information service provider to the Swiss Abroad. After the closure of Swiss Radio International, swissinfo remains the only world-wide media showcasing Switzerland in all national languages as well as the major world languages. swissinfo is Switzerland's virtual window to the world and provides an essential information service to Swiss Abroad.

We appreciate very much the support we have received from members of the local Swiss community in our campaign to save swissinfo! The CSA has two demands: a return to 6 Swiss Review editions per year from 2011, and maintaining federal funding for swissinfo.

Editor's Note. Swiss Review - Stats and Facts

Back in May, the ASO conducted a survey and asked 2850 recipients how they would prefer to receive the Swiss Review in the future, either in print or electronically. Interestingly, they got over 1130 responses (which is quite high for such a survey) and 70% still prefer the print version. It also seems that the print version is read more thoroughly as 79% or the recipients read the whole Review from A-Z in comparision to only 46% receiving the email copy. Also, the return to 6 issues per year had the most votes. (Source: ASO May 2010)

This clearly shows that there is a strong demand for print media such as ours. Unfortunately, about 30% of all participants in this survey complained that they had problems with the timely delivery, mostly caused buy a change of address. Therefore, make sure that you are registered properly with the Consulate. If you have missed an edition, you can also download the most recent issues on the revue website.

In regards to the contents of our own 4 regional pages, I have planned to change the format a bit. It has been voiced to me now on several occasions that some of the reports contain very localized information which are not that interesting to other readers residing in other states; also most clubs now have a website which members can read reports of their past events in full. What I plan to focus on from now is still to provide basic contact details as before but shorten the club reports and publish more stories and CSA activities. Of course, if you have any good ideas or like to contribute an article please let me know. At the end it's your publication and I want You to be one of the «99%» which reads the Regional Pages from A-Z.
