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The *Eclogae Geologicae Helveticae* (EGH, Swiss Journal of Geosciences) publish original geoscientific contributions of international interest. Preferred are interdisciplinary and/or process-oriented papers – mainly, but not exclusively, from the Tethys realm and adjacent regions. The general or international interest of papers should also be evident for non-specialists. Manuscripts may not be submitted in the same time to another periodical, nor should they have been refused by another periodical in their present form.

Manuscripts should be submitted to one of the two Chief Editors: Dr. Stefan Bucher for geological subjects, Dr. Jean-Paul Billon-Bruyat for paleontological subjects. They will ask one of the Associate Editors to organize the reviewing procedure.

Languages

The EGH publish papers in English, German, French and Italian, **preferably, however, in English**.

In addition to the full title a **running title** (max. 50 characters) in the language of the manuscript should be given and, if necessary, an English translation of the full title.

Key words should always also be given in English, too.

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Please observe carefully the following instructions in order to avoid a delayed reviewing procedure:

A – Please provide **3 copies** of text, tables, figures and plates.

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C – Introduce printing types such as *italics*, **bold**, underlined, SMALL CAPS directly in the manuscript;

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F – The use of **paleontological names** (genera and species) should be in agreement with the International Codes of Nomenclature: names of the authors of taxa in small caps, use of brackets in accordance with general rules. First descriptions of taxa will not be mentioned in the References, unless the respective publication is also specifically quoted in the text.

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When reference is made to a publication by **2 authors** the sign “&” should be used: Arthaud & Matte, (1975).

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Publications are arranged alphabetically after the first author; only initials of the first names shall be indicated, family names in full.
