## CARROT SALAD WITH A DIFFERENCE

Grate the carrots, decorate with walnut pieces, radishes and chopped parsley and chives. Instead of the usual dressing, use pure orange juice.

### BRAISED CARROTS WITH JOGHURT

Use young carrots. Boil and then skin the carrots. Shake well in hot butter, add chopped parsley, salt and nutmeg. Lastly generously pour joghurt over the carrots and let simmer (occasionally shaking the saucepan) for another 6 minutes. —H.B.
