## HEDY'S CORNER . . .

Pre-Christmas excitement will lend itself ideally for making decorations for the Christmas tree, table, gift parcels or cards.

### **Gold Walnuts** (to hang on the tree)

Drill two small holes at upper end of walnut. Pull a thin string through the holes and tie into a loop. Paint one half of nut with gold paint (available in any paint shop); when dry paint the other half. Quick way: plunge nut and string in gold paint tin, hang up to dry, checking that paint drips off evenly, correcting with paint brush if necessary.

### **Gold Stars**

Material required: Large sheet of cardboard or poster-paper, gold paint, paint brush, pencil, ruler, smooth-rimmed saucer, 1 glass, scissors.

To make six-pointed star: Have wrong side of cardboard uppermost, place saucer on cardboard and outline saucer shape with pencil. Imagine circle to be a clock and mark positions of 12, 2, 4, 6, 8, 10 o'clock, making pencil dots. Now take the glass, place this accurately in centre of outer circle and outline glass rim with pencil. As described above mark numerals on glass circle, but making dots on 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, 11 o'clock. Finally join dots of outer and inner circles with pencilled, straight lines, using ruler for accuracy. Now turn your cardboard over, paint with gold paint. Leave to dry and finally cut out shape with scissors.
