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

Trip to Somes Island, Sunday 29th October.

Many of us have always marvelled at the tiny little Island that is lying in the middle of Wellington harbour - but for one reason or the other had always missed the boat which usually only left once a year in January. But the times are different now... The Trustbank ferry took us over in just a short 20 minutes ride. We walked the 2 km circuit track, admired the world's largest collection of really big seagulls, made photos of the island's lighthouse Sentinel and felt like sunbathing in the lichen covered gun emplacement. One of the highlights was



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the seminar given by Trudie Bruehlmann on the reforestation of the island with native trees. Ruth Messmer brought 67 tree plants from her own garden to be resettled on the island.

Though the island appears unassuming now, it has a tumultuous past: it served as an internment camp in both World Wars and as a quarantine station for people and more recently animals. A pa site could be found until 1835. Name plates of native plants are interspersed with the marked graves. There is a monument to the victims of smallpox and influenza who died between 1870 and 1920 while quarantined on the island.

All the 23 of us enjoyed this small adventure and can't wait to take some visitors over there to show them this pearl in 128Nicholson Harbour.


