

HAZY OSTERWALD

You can hardly believe it, but the famous Swiss composer and band leader, Hazy Osterwald has just celebrated his 75th anniversary. In typical Hazy fashion, he did not spend his birthday at home amongst his family like most elderly people would do, but in the Kruger Park in South Africa surrounded by hyenas and rhinoceroses.

Some of you elderly readers may well remember Hazy's debut in 1944 at the then famous Bernese nightclub called "Chikito". In 1949 he formed his world famous sextet which stayed together until 1979. During this time he made several musical films and world tours plus radio and TV shows.

How Rolf Osterwald (his real name) came to his first name Hazy is quite a story. His father was a well known footballer and, during the matches, his fans used to call "Hopp Häsi". This nickname "Häsi" was then also given to Rolf by his school mates. In 1942 he fell in love with a girl from London who changed his name in her letter to him from "Häsi" to "Hazy". Eventually, Rolf decided to make this his stagename and so he became known worldwide as Hazy Osterwald.
