

Do you know the names of these three famous Swiss mountains?

Situated in the Bernese Oberland, these three mountains (3970m / 4099m / 4158m) are usually mentioned together, by first naming the mountain on the left in the picture. A major tourist attraction, these three mountains are accessible by the famous cogwheel train from Lauterbrunnen to Kleine Scheidegg, entering the tunneling system of the first mountain near its north face, then travelling through the "Eismeer" (Sea of Ice) and reaching the plateau of the third mountain at 3454 m above sea level. Here an incredible world of eternal snow and ice presents itself to the visitor. Besides a meteorological observatory and a restaurant with panoramic views, visitors can enjoy ice sculptures inside the "Eispalast" (a cavern inside the glacier). The cogwheel train-terminal is Europe's highest railway station.
