

## Adolf Mathias Flühler 1915 – 2002





Dölfi was born near Stans/Canton of Unterwalden in June 1915, the second oldest of three girls and five boys. Loosing his Mother at an early age he grew up as a foster child in the family of his Uncle. He had a rather sad childhood and remembered difficult times, particularly in the thirties, when unemployment in Switzerland was as high as 20-30 %.

In 1939, at 24 years of age, together with two brothers and one sister, he emigrated to New Zealand arriving in Wellington in the company of 23 fellow Swiss immigrants. Dölfi found employment on the farm of the late Miss Ida Bernold of Kaponga until becoming self employed. He became a well known identity felling trees and selling firewood in the Kaponga and Manaia area.

Together with Bob Hiestand he moved to Putaruru and on to Tokoroa where he built two shops and later set himself up as a shoe repairer. Doing justice to a full time business and taking care of his own household became too much and Dölfi then worked for many years pruning and planting trees for the forestry department at Tokoroa. During this time he purchased a section at Cooks Beach on the east coast of the North Island and travelling from Tokoroa on weekends he built himself a house. Consequently he moved to Cooks Beach building two more houses in his spare time and working for contractors building bridges and taking on general roadworks.

In 1985 Dölfi returned to Kaponga to be near the mountain he often talked about and to enjoy the activities of the Swiss Club. He loved to play Swiss Cards. - Sadly in 1993 Dölfi was diagnosed with a very rare disease of Anemia and with progressive ill health he finally moved to Trinity Rest Home in 1999, where he spent the rest of his days.

The Requiem Mass for Dölfi was celebrated at St. Patrick's Catholic Church on Friday 18th January 2002.
