The Festival of the Lights is open daily from 8.30pm to 10.45pm at Pukekura Park, and the circuit takes a popular route that includes the Fountain Lake, Hatchery Lawn, Main

Lake, Kiosk, Upper Lake area and Rhododendron Dell (unfortunately the Fernery is not included this season).

Music and/or entertainment activities are focused on two main areas - the Hatchery Lawn near the Fountain Lake and the Boatshed Lawn at the southern end of the main lake near the Rhododendron Dell. A wide variety of free music and entertainment is provided nightly throughout the Festival. Some entertainment will start earlier (around 7.00pm). The wooden clinker boats are available for that romantic row every night. Good car parking facilities are available.

A decision to postpone the Festival (due to inclement weather and/or unsafe conditions) is made between 6.00pm - 7.00pm. It is broadcast over the local radio stations.

Believe me it is a wonderful display of lights, and well worth seeing if you are in our province during the stated time.
