Obituary, Elise Oettli - Schweizer

Elise Schweizer was born in Weinfelden, Switzerland, on February 8, 1912. Her father worked for the railways, the Mittel Thurgau

In 1924, Elise's father was killed in a railway accident. Her mother had to manage, bringing up two children on a tiny pension and taking in boarders. Elise's great aspiration

was to be a teacher, but her mother couldn't afford to pay the tuition fees. So Elise, generally called Lisi or Liseli, did a secretarial course. She joined the local Chamber of Commerce evening classes for shorthand; this is where she met her future husband, Hans Oettli

They married on the March 1, 1938. Their first son, Peter, was born, on the March 9, 1940. A daughter, Heidi, followed in 1941, and then two boys, Erich and Max, in 1945 and 1947.

In the years after the war, Elise was a busy mother and housewife and Hans was manager



of a mortgage guarantee company. In 1956, the family emigrated to New Zealand to go farming. Elise exchanged her comfortable position of well-to-do lady engaged in her community, with that of a farmer's wife living in the then comparatively isolated community of Whatawhata near Hamilton, where she joined several local welfare groups, including the Maori Women's Welfare League.

Hans and Elise retired from farming in 1973. They bought a house in Hamilton where they planned to enjoy their retirement. But then Hans passed away in 1974.

Elise moved to the house at 6 Olympia Place, Hamilton, which she was destined not to leave until a few months before her death. Over the years she was involved in serving her community, participating in the activities of the Swiss Club, and regularly playing Jass.

Elise is survived by four children, nine grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.
