Kiwifruit

- a little bit about it.

The Kiwifruit plant originally came from the Yangtze Valley in China many many years ago and indeed in this country was known as the "Chinese Gooseberry." In NZ the industry began with a few pioneers in the 1950's, and about this time the first Kiwifruit were exported to England. The main beginning of the industry took place in the 1970's.

Kiwifruit has a number of unique qualities - it's very rich in Vitamin C (twice as much as an orange), high levels of Vitamin E (twice as much as an avocado), high in Potassium and other minerals and has a substantial fibre content. Another feature of the Kiwifruit is that it can be stored under refrigeration at slightly above zero degrees Celcius for over nine months.

The vines produce their first crop in about 4 years, and reach full production at the age of 7. There must be a male and a female plant, with the ratio being about one male plant to seven female plants. Only the female plants bear fruit.
