Obituary, Hans Graf 29 May 1918 - 6 September 2003



Hans arrived in New Zealand from Switzerland in May 1954 with his wife to be, Klara. He spent his working life at the Kinleith Paper Mill, Tokoroa, until his retirement in 1983 at the age of 65 years. Klara and Hans had three children - Urs, Richard and Linda. Hans was a keen fisherman and hunter, and he also liked to play a game of Swiss cards (Jass). In his later years he

suffered progressively from Parkinson's Disease, and in May 2003 he had to be transferred to the Cantabria Resthome in Rotorua, where he died peacefully in his sleep. He is survived by his wife, children, and eight grandchildren.

Our deepest sympathy is extended to Klara and family from the Hamilton Swiss Club. May he rest in peace.

Obituary, Martha Wenk - Frischknecht 2 July 1920 - 11 August 2003



Martha Wenk, nee Frischknecht, was born in Adliswil, Zürich, on 2. July 1920. She worked in a paper factory for 20 years. Marriage to Georg Wenk, from St. Gallen, followed, and in early 1961 the couple emigrated to New Zealand. They started out in Taranaki, where Georg drove a truck, but they wanted to farm, and were offered a job by another Swiss at Tauhel, near Matamata. They then

moved to a sharemilking

position near Cambridge,

before progressing to their own farm on Maiseys Road, Matamata. When the farm was later sold, Martha and Georg retired together to Matamata. Martha loved to garden and cook. Roger and the Grandchildren were her love and joy, and fullfilled her life. She and

Georg had been married for 55 years when he passed away a few years ago. Martha then once more travelled back to her homeland in Switzerland. Her health began to deteriorate, so she moved into a pensioner flat, and finally to Country Lodge Rest Home. After a few years of poor health, Martha gave up her struggle to live and passed away peacefully. Her funeral was well attended
