7 President's Report

Roland Schütz acknowledges the work of the Helvetia team. He then points out that the Swiss Society and the Swiss clubs are there to conserve and promote Swiss tradition and culture, and to support each other in an emergency. Marcel Rüedi moves the report, and Herbert Stäheli seconds it.

9 Treasurer's Report

Heidi Amelung explains the figures on the balance sheet. The financial situation looks positive; we accumulated more funds. Although we offered help to the Christchurch Swiss the offer wasn't taken up by anybody.

As we are not asking for grants, an auditor is not needed. Heidi Amelung thanks John Alderdice who checked the accounts for us. Paul Amstalden moves that the report be accepted, and Hans Iten seconds it.

10 Delegate of the Swiss Abroad's Report

Othmar Hebler reports that Mani Züst will represent New Zealand at the 88th Auslandschweizerkongress in Lugano, 20th - 22nd August. His report on ASO concerns has been printed in full in the August/September Helvetia 2011. Othmar Hebler moves that his report be accepted, and Heinz Leuenberger seconds it.

11 Riflemaster's Report

Mark Kiser reports that the competitions for the

medals have gone well. The compiling of the results is a major exercise, but the medals should be ready for distribution on 1st August. He moves that his report be accepted, and Paul Amstalden seconds it.

12 Setting of Subscriptions 2011/2012

Mathias Seifert moves that the subscriptions should stay the same, i.e. \$25. Marlies Hebler seconds it.

13 Election of Officers

For the last year the Society resides in Wellington all office holders are re-elected, with the only change being that the club where the Society goes next year, i.e. Auckland, holds the job of Vice-President. So the office holders for 2011/12 are Roland Schütz, president; Marcel Rüedi, vice president; Heidi Amelung, treasurer; Trudi Brühlmann, secretary and editor; Mark Kiser, rifle master. Roland Schütz moves that the elections be accepted, and Heinz Leuenberger seconds it.

14 General Business

14.1 Motion by Hans Vetsch: Hans Vetsch proposes that the Swiss Society make a donation of \$5000 to the Red Cross Christchurch Earthquake Appeal. The Hamilton Swiss club and the Auckland Swiss club have already made donations to the fund. The motion is unopposed. Herbert Stäheli moves that the motion be accepted, and Anna Rufer seconds it.

14.2 Rules for Society Competition: Marcel Rüedi offers to look into the rules for Jassen and maybe to propose new rules. It is also suggested that the Steinstossen is turned into proper Kugelstossen, with a standardized weight of the Kugel/Stein. Othmar Hebler supports this change.

14.3 Club Reports

Taranaki: The Taranaki president Othmar Hebler

reports that the club has 277 members. Participation in the club's events is strong, especially in shooting, fondue and in the picnic with about 350 guests! The club has a strong, active committee. Card playing in the club isn't as popular in Taranaki as in Hamilton.

Auckland: The Auckland president Marcel Rüedi reports that the club has well over 200 members. Jass has become popular and attracts all ages. Samichlaus had an audience of over 60 children. A highlight was the participation of six Auckland Schützen at the Eidgenössische Schützenfest. Another highlight in the club year was the Market Day - all possible thanks to a dedicated committee.

Hamilton: The Hamilton president Herbert Stäheli reports on very successful card evenings and successful events such as the picnic and 1st August at lunch time rather than in the evening. 140 people came to the fondue! He praises his hard-working committee.

Wellington: The Wellington past president Roland Schütz reports that he has resigned; a new president has to be found at an extraordinary AGM. The Wellington Swiss club is much smaller than the other clubs; nevertheless, the events are always a great success with up to 100 guests.
