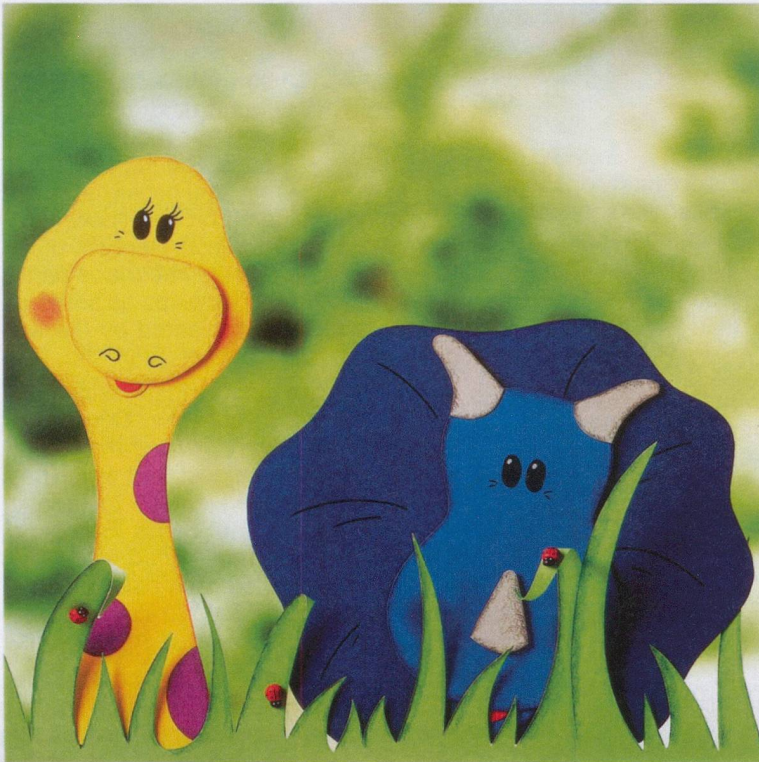

Kids' corner

3D-Picture with Dinosaurs



Materials: Thick paper in yellow, dark blue and light blue / small pieces of thick paper in grey, purple, red and green / white crayon or white paint / black felt pen / glue / foam layering tape (scrap booking).

Dinosaurs:

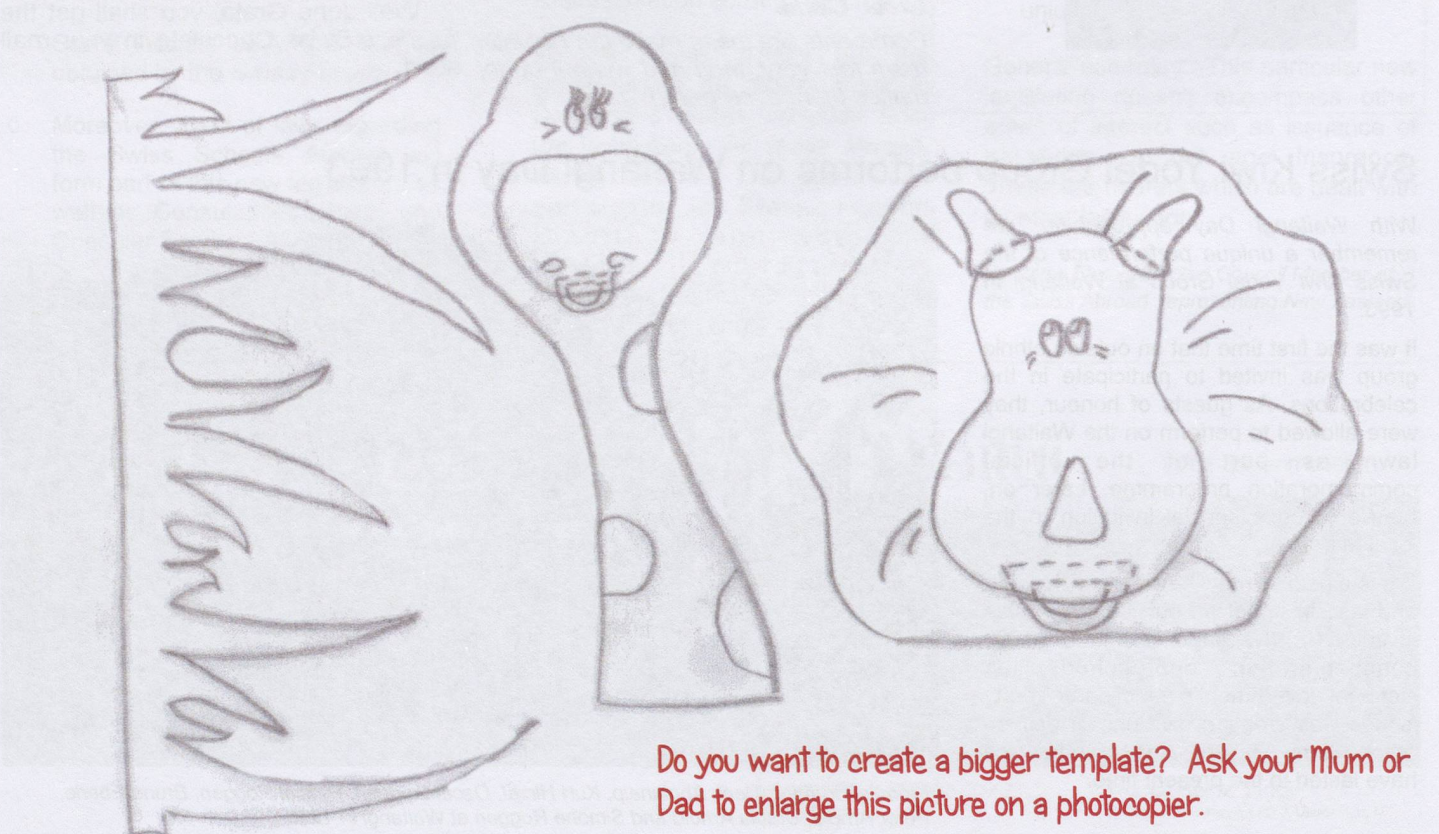
Copy all parts of the template and cut out. If you want, you can shade the borders of each piece as shown on the finished picture. With a black felt pen, draw the eyes, nostrils, eyelashes and lines on the dinos, and put a white dot in the upper corner of each eye. Glue the tongues to the underside of the mouths and the two upper horns of the blue dino to the top of his head. Glue the purple dots on the yellow dino. Alternatively, you can use a felt pen to colour these dots in. Then stick the head of the blue dino and the snout of the yellow dino on with the foam tape for the 3D effect. Also use foam tape to stick the lower horn on the blue dino.

Grass:

Cut out grass template twice. Glue both parts together and roll some of the grasses with a pencil. Ladybugs can be drawn with felt pens or glued on with red paper for effect. You can either glue the dinos and grass on a piece of paper or form a ring with the grass and stand it upright with the dinos glued to the grass.
