### Dear Helvetia Readers

What a busy summer this has been for us Swiss-Kiwis, judging by the many events that have been held by the clubs over this summer. The events look so easy and seamless from the outside and yet there is a tremendous amount of planning, organisation and implementation involved by the various committees and their members. And then there are the countless contributions by many individuals - from bringing plates, making cups of tea, cooking dinner, erecting bouncy castles (weather permitting), serving, washing up, scrubbing, mowing lawns, cleaning toilets, tallying up results from jassen, kegeln and shooting, organising children's games, to ordering medals - the list is truly endless. Club secretaries faithfully report, encourage and make sure everyone is thanked for their contributions, which is essential.

Did you know that New Zealand is 4th in the world on the "World Giving Index"? 40% of New Zealanders donate time to good causes. But that's not all: There are highly beneficial effects of volunteering on physical, emotional and mental health. For example, a recent study found that volunteering for 200 hours per year reduces blood pressure by 40%! Similarly, cholesterol, Body Mass Index and inflammation have been found to be reduced in volunteers (although I dare say researchers did not take into account the consumption of cervelats and bratwurst). Not only that, volunteering also increases life expectancy. I guess in the light of so much positive research, we just have to keep up the good work!


