The usual Annual Concert and Dance, in aid of the Fonds de Secours, was held on October 28th, at the "Schweizerbund," Charlotte Street, and was patronised by over 175 members and friends, in spite of the adverse weather conditions.

As many of our friends are not conversant with the Italian language, an All-English, or British programme was decided upon, and Mr. C. Berti, who was mainly instrumental in the selection of the artists, can be complimented on his good choice. Messrs. Cliff Hunter, Lionel King and Claude Chandler were responsible for humorous entertainment and conjuring; Miss Millicent Altman, Miss Irene Clifford and Mr. John Colman for song, and the little Jennie Bruger and Diana Freeman for child dancing and elocution. The artists, one and all, were very good, and by general consent, the entertainment proved most enjoyable.

At the end of the concert a substantial proportion of those present adjourned to dinner on the first floor, whilst many lost no time in opening the dance and others were kept busy by their friends.

In the early part of the evening, the President, Mr. W. Notari, rose to welcome the gathering, and particularly mentioned Mr. R. Dupraz and Mr. F. M. Gamber, of the Fonds de Secours, Mr. Marchand, President of the City Swiss Club and Dr. Rezzonico of the Swiss Legation. He also read a communication from Mr. A. Meschini, our Hon. Vice President, expressing regret that he could not be present, owing to an important previous engagement, but wishing us all a pleasant and successful evening.

The dancing continued till about 2 a.m. and was swelled by a good number of late-comers. The Fonds de Secours will benefit by about the same amount as usual, and it is hoped that this successful opening of the Season will be a prelude to further successes. O.B.
