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IL TIRO FEDERALE A BELLINZONA.

Per ben diciassette giorni Bellinzona fu in tripudio di gioia la cittadina dai vetusti castelli, di solito così calma, si è trasformata completamente e dopo lungo arduo lavoro di preparazione, di organizzazione si presentò bella e serena, superba nella sua splendida nuova veste, alle migliaia di persone che qui accorsero in occasione del tiro federale. Avvenimento grandioso e storico—che imprime e rafforza negli animi l'amore per la patria libera e forte. Avvenimento pieno di sublime allegoria.

A Bellinzona vennero i rappresentanti d'ogni cantone nostro, quivi convennero famosi tiratori, e sul campo di tiro, di una meravigliosa imponenza, vastissimo e comodo, sorto come per incanto piccolo villaggio in miniatura, per diciassette giorni di patriottico fervore i confederati delle nostre tre stirpi. Nella Cantina, capace di ben 4,000 persone sedute, quasi ogni sera si dava, da 600 artisti tra coristi, a soli e musicisti (e tutti quanti semplici dilettanti) lo spettacolo della Festa "Vita nostra"—grazioso gioiello musicale che tante acclamazioni suscitò e raccolse. Accanto, la Birreria—capace di 2,000

persone—poi il simpatico grotto ticinese dove il nostro nullo veniva servito da graziose forosette dal tipico costume paesano; il Tempio dei Premi: ricca raccolta di splendidi premi tra i quali una coppa di argento pesante, foggiate appositamente a guisa di castello, con l'orlo merlato, ed il biscione bellinzonese ommaggio geniale della Swiss Rifle Association di Londra. Lo stand del tiro al fucile lungo ben 210 metri, quello per tiro alla pistola; le zampillanti fontane; i giardinetti ameni; gli uffici della posta e telegrafo; del quarto potere: la stampa; l'infirmeria; il parco dei divertimenti; i chioschi caratteristici.

La giornata di sabato, 27 luglio, fu dedicata agli svizzeri all'estero, agli "svizzeri emigrati nei paesi del continente ed oltre gli oceani, i validi affermatore della nostra civiltà, i divulgatori dei nostri principii di democrazia, gli esponenti di una magnifica attività economica, i missionari delle nostre idealità e della nostra cultura"—come parlò l'on. Cons. di Stato Galli a questi figli d'Elvezia che vivono lontani dalla terra nativa ma che sempre ricordano e amano—Ben tredici sezioni qui vennero dall'estero: da Parigi, da Milano, da Bruxelles, dagli Stati Uniti, dalla lontana Buenos Aires e il gruppo londinese della Swiss Rifle Association—forte di ben 27 membri tra tiratori e amici, con la sua sfolorante bandiera splendida per disegno e colori—accompagnato da un tipico John Bull recante la bandiera britannica—e sfoggianti tutti quanti caratteristiche berretti militari inglesi—gruppo che tanto si fece ammirare ed acclamare e che si classificò sesto nell'ardua gara di tiro, guadagnandosi una graziosa coppa d'argento, una medaglia di bronzo (per ogni tiratore questa) e una corona d'alloro che cinse e battezzò di gloria la bandiera.

Bellinzona riserbo, per questi suoi ospiti, una calorosa, spontanea accoglienza.

Bellinzona è rientrata ora nella sua solita calma, di città laboriosa, ma gli echi del tiro federale a lungo volteggiarono per l'aria limpida, per i vetusti castelli, nelle case e per le vie. —E.L.

The prize distribution followed during the afternoon and all sections from abroad were presented with a laurel and a silver cup.

Merry hours in the Festhütte amongst friends of old and new ended this successful and unregretted excursion; some of our members returned with the transalpine coach via St. Gotthard, Furka, Grimsel, Bern-Basle, a few going by Express; others—more lucky ones—completed their annual holidays on native soil, but all are united to enlist again for the next Tir Fédéral.
