PROF. BRUNNER AT KING'S COLLEGE.

Prof. Dr. Emil Brunner, the well-known theologist of the Zurich University, whose relig-ious conceptions and teaching have a great reper-cussion in Switzerland, Germany and other coun-tries, has been asked by King's College, London, to give a course of five lectures under the subject : "The Word and the World."

Our distinguished compatriot spoke last week successively in English about "The Word of God and Reason," The Word of Christ and History," "The Word of the Spirit and Psych-ology," "The Word of the Bible and Science," "The Word of the Church and Society." The lectures attracted each time larger audiences amongst which many distinguished English per-sonalities. It has been heard from rationa sides sonalities. It has been heard from various sides that the affimative and vigorous doctrine of this leader of a new and powerful movement has had a large repercussion in British circles.

The Swiss Minister, Monsieur C. R. Para-vincini, who was present at one of the lectures, entertained on Saturday last, Prof. Brunner at luncheon at 21, Bryanston Square.

L. Micheli, ler Secrétaire de Légation.
