Excursions from Lugano to Locarno and Return.—From 16th March to 14th May, 1931. The following trains have been put on to encourage the excursion traffic between the two health resorts of Lugano and Locarno:

Air Communications in the Spring of 1931.—From 1st March to 30th April, services are maintained, according to the spring time-table, on the following routes:

1. Geneva Zurich Munich Vienna Budapest.
2. Bâle Mannheim Frankfurt Cologne Essen-Müllheim Amsterdam.
3. Zurich Stuttgart Frankfurt.
4. Geneva Lyons Paris London.
5. Stuttgart Geneva Marseille Barcelona (Thrice Weekly).

Official Swiss Air Time-Table for the Spring of 1931.—The Swiss Air Union, in Zurich, published an air time-table at the beginning of March, the opening of this year's flying season, which among other things contain the following valuable information: time-table of the routes covered at the present moment, train connections passenger fares and excess luggage tariffs, extracts from the goods-by-air tariff for 1931, etc.

Tourist Map of Switzerland.—The Publicity Bureau of the Swiss Federal Railways has just published a map of Switzerland illustrating for the benefit of visitors to Switzerland railway communications, motor postal coach services, and steamer services on the lakes. The lines of the Swiss Federal Railways are clearly marked in red. Those who are interested in this map should apply direct to the Commercial Service of the Swiss Federal Railways, Publicity Department, Berne. This map is coming out in German only.

Tourist Map of Switzerland:—Published by the Publicity Bureau of the Swiss Federal Railways. In German only.

Davos:—Programme in English of the fourth Davos University courses, obtainable from the Davos Sports Office.

Skiing Schools and Courses.—
