SWISS CLUB BIRMINGHAM.

The Annual General Meeting of the Swiss Club Birmingham took place on the 9th inst. at the Grand Hotel, Birmingham, under the Presidency of M. P. Brun.

M. P. A. Duvoisin, Hon. Secretary read out the minutes of the last General Meeting, which were unanimously passed.
