EDITOR'S POST-BAG.

To the Editor,

Dear Sir,

It was with interest that I read your article on the passing of Messrs. A. & S. Gatti, in the Strand.

May I point out, however, that the details given were not quite complete.

After the death of Stefano and Agostino Gatti, the sons of the latter — John Maria and Rocco — carried on the business. Their foresight in introducing modern methods was mainly responsible for the worldwide fame of this establishment.

Among other interests besides those of the theatrical world, John Maria and Rocco were the Promotors and Directors of the then "Strand, Westminster Electricity Corporation."

Mr. John Maria Gatti — later Sir John — had also been Chairman of the London County Council Finance Committee and in 1911 was elected Mayor of the City of Westminster.

May I be allowed to give you the text of an Illuminated Address of Congratulation the Unione Ticinese presented to its most distinguished member.

"To John Maria Gatti, on the occasion of his being nominated Mayor of the City of Westminster, 1911-1912.

Sir,

We, the members of the Unione Ticinese, Mutual Aid Society, hailing with delight and just pride your selection to this most honoured and eminent position of Mayor of the City of Westminster, respectfully offer to you our unanimous and sincerest congratulations on this auspicious occasion. Scion of the ever to be lamented Agostino Gatti, your illustrious father, the Swiss Ticinesi's friend in London and of Stefano Gatti, our first President and Trustee, his co-operator and faithful partner, both the natural idols and pride of the Italo-Swiss community in London, you in early manhood are showing the fruits of the sound cultured education and example instilled into your mind by your Swiss forefathers. Although naturalisation has made you a faithful subject of your adopted Country the welcome hospitality of which country so many Ticinesi have and still enjoy, nevertheless the Swiss blood that still runs in your veins will readily force you to realize why as a Trustee of our time-honoured Society, we feel it our jubilant duty to offer you these heartfelt congratulations. In so doing we with proud and grateful feelings recognize the honour done to the Anglo-Swiss community in London by those who have thought fit to vote you to the position of Mayor of one
