PIUS (EMILE) ZGRAGGEN †

We deeply regret to announce the death of Mr. P. E. Zgraggen, which occurred recently.

The deceased was born at Gurtnellen (canton Uri) sixty-two years ago, and after an apprenticeship in the hotel profession came to London in the year 1904.

During his long stay in this country, Mr. Zgraggen occupied various positions in some of the largest hotels of the Metropolis, such as the Kensington Palace Hotel, the Cecil, the Ritz, the Savoy, the Berkeley, the Cumberland and Brown's Hotel; at the latter he held the position as Head Porter and there he suffered a heart attack from which he unfortunately did not recover.

P. E. Zgraggen, or "Bill," as he was affectionately called by his many friends, was well known in the Swiss Colony; he was for many years a member of the "Union Helvetia" in which institution he took a great interest, as well as of the Swiss Club (Schweizerbund).

Through all his long $s e_{jour}$ in this country he remained a good and faithful Swiss; he attended many of the patriotic gatherings and his cheerfulness and kindliness made him liked wherever he went and his all too early demise is deeply felt by all his friends far and near.

P. E. Zgraggen leaves behind a widow and three daughters to whom we express our deepest sympathy in their sad bereavement.

The funeral took place on Tuesday, October 29th, 1946, at Hendon Cemetery, where a large congregation accompanied him to his last resting place.
