COMMUNICATION OF THE INTERNATIONAL RED CROSS COMMITTEE.

The International Committee of the Red Cross and the League of Red Cross Societies make the following communication:—

The Joint Relief Commission of the International Red Cross, set up conjointly by the two institutions mentioned above for the co-ordination of their activities on behalf of civilian populations who are victims of the war, will be liquidated as from November 1st, 1946.

The International Committee of the Red Cross will pursue their work of facilitating and encouraging relief to civilian populations, as to all other war victims, particularly by making their needs known and by placing the Committee's delegations at the disposal of the donors in countries or occupied territories where the intermediary of a neutral agency is required.

The League of Red Cross Societies undertakes the despatch to civilian populations of gifts from National Red Cross Societies, and keeps such Societies as are able to furnish relief, acquainted with the needs of other Red Cross Societies in distressed areas.

The "International Relief Centre for Civilian Populations" (centre d'entraide internationale aux populations civiles) which, as recently announced, has been set up in Geneva, will, as from 1st November, 1946, undertake all relief work for which it receives a mandate from other contributing organizations, and will receive, purchase, transport or distribute relief supplies for civilian populations suffering from the effects of war. Further, following an agreement made between the International Committee and the League, the above Relief Centre will take over, in the name and on behalf of the Joint Relief Commission in liquidation, all commitments pending at the time of liquidation. In this manner, the continuity of relief activities in favour of civilian populations will be ensured during the whole of the time that such action may appear necessary.

L'ACTION DU DON SUISSE.

Dans le cadre de l'action contre la disette le Don suisse, entre le 10 et le 23 septembre, a expédié 1564 tonnes de denrées alimentaires dans les pays suivants: Autriche 364 tonnes pour Vienne, Innsbruck et Graz; Allemagne 911 tonnes dont 373 pour Berlin et le reste réparti entre les villes de Coblenze, Duisbourg, Fribourg, Freudenstadt pour ne citer que les envois les plus importants; Hongrie 175 tonnes pour Budapest, Italie 115 tonnes, pour Florence en particulier, puis pour Trévise, Verone, Bologne, Rimini et Gènes. Une grande pénurie de chaussures se faisant sentir en Allemagne, plus d'une tonne a été envoyée à chacune des villes de Berlin, de Dortmund et de Cologne, et proportionnellement à leur population aux villes de Coblenze, Mayence, Fribourg et de Sarrebruck; 35 tonnes de savon et produits pharmaceutiques ont été envoyés à Berlin, 3 tonnes de matériel divers tels que papier, matelas etc. ont été envoyés à Vienne.

Par camion ont été transportés des tissus, des ciseaux, etc. d'un poids total de 3 tonnes, distribués aux villes de la zone anglaise dans lesquelles le Don suisse a établi des ouvriers, qui sont Cologne, Jülich, Düren, Goch, Bochum, Dortmund, Gelsenkirchen.

Dans un pays démuné de tout, il faut penser aux plus petites choses: 528 brosses à dent ont été envoyées à Coblenze.
