### SWISS CATHOLICS ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

On Sunday, April 13th, the Swiss Catholics were invited to the Annual General Meeting at St. Peter's Hall, Westminster. The meeting was preceded by a Service at The Palace Street Church when Rev. Fr. Würms preached and Rev. Fr. Lanfranchi gave solemn benediction.

Undoubtedly due to the fine weather, the first Sunday with sunshine for months, the attendance was poor at the Church and at the meeting, but what was lacking in numbers was made up for in excellent spirit by those present.

In the unavoidable absence of both President Col. A. Bon and Mr. C. Schumacher, Chairman, Mr. C. Berti, Vice-Chairman, presided. The Chairman's report, read in his absence by Mr. Boos, the Hon. Secretary, and the Chaplain's report were received with applause and duly adopted and will be circulated in due course to our compatriots.

Mr. Vögtlin paid tribute to the Members of the Committee for the work done in 1946, and proposed that they be re-elected for 1947, which proposal received approval by all present.

Our compatriots attention is specially drawn to the article in this issue of "Bruder Klaus" and are asked to reserve Sunday afternoon and evening, 1st June, 1947, for the celebration in London, to commemorate the Canonisation of the great Swiss. Full details will be published later.
