SPORT EVENTS.

Ski-ing.

After the Olympic winter games, the most active town of St. Moritz has admirably organised the Swiss Skiing Championship. The competition took place over the week-end 26/27th February. They were accompanied by marvellous winter sunshine and very good snow conditions. It thus happened that the time for the downhill and Slalom races, which were organised on exactly the same tracks as the Olympic competitions, were considerably better than those obtained during the Olympic games. The results were the following:—

Another skiing championship was organised by the Ski Club of Saas-Fee, namely the long distance race over 50 km. This extremely difficult race was won by Robert Zurbriggen, Saas-Fee, from Edi Schild, Kandersteg, who was more than 10 minutes behind the winner. 48 participants competed in this championship, which constitutes a record number of entries.

The "Parsenn-Derby" was organised over the week-end 6/7th March and there were 192 entries. Here again, the conditions were excellent and allowed the establishing of new records.

Staeger, Wengen, finished 16th.
