PERSONAL.

We express deep sympathy to Mr. and Mrs. M. Schönholzer, of "Helvetia", 17, Haydn Avenue, Purley, Surrey, on the death of their eldest son, J. J. Schönholzer, at the age of twenty-five, which occurred on New Year's eve in an air disaster in Italy.

The air-liner which he commanded and which was on its way from Greece to the Riviera crashed into a mountain side near Orbetello (Italy), due to unfavourable weather conditions, with the loss of life of all occupants.

Of dual nationality, the deceased served as an officer in the R.A.F. during the last war, and afterwards entered the services of a South African air charter company, who soon promoted him to Captain of one of their air-liners.
