HOLIDAYS IN SWITZERLAND FOR SWISS CHILDREN IN THE U.K.


The London Group of the New Helvetic Society, in conjunction with "PRO JUVENTUTE" in Zurich, propose to organize again this year a holiday in Switzerland for children of 8—15 years, of Swiss parents living in the United Kingdom, provided there is a sufficient number of participants.

The holidays would start from about end of July and would last about 6—8 weeks.

It is hoped that the journey from London to Switzerland and back may again be undertaken by a plane of SWISSAIR on special terms, and at a cost not exceeding 50% of the normal fare, i.e. about £14 per child. Alternatively, the journey may be organized by rail.

For those children whose parents are unable to defray the cost of the journey, the N.S.H. in conjunction with the Swiss Benevolent Societies would endeavour to provide the necessary means.

"PRO JUVENTUTE" have kindly offered to provide the necessary funds for board and lodging in Switzerland for those children whose parents are unable to bear the cost. For paying members of the party the specially reduced price would be about Frs. 5.50 per day or a total of about £15 for 7 weeks.

- or (b) what contribution towards either of these items,
- or (c) nothing at all.

It is pointed out by "PRO JUVENTUTE" that it is becoming increasingly difficult to provide holidays in Swiss families free of charge in view of the large and ever increasing number of children that has to be provided for from all over Europe, and parents who are in a position to do so are, therefore, expected to pay for board and lodging which, as mentioned above, will be provided at comparatively low cost. Those unable to bear the whole cost are kindly requested to contribute whatever they can within the limits of their means.
