## DINNER OF THE FOREIGN PRESS ASSOCIATION IN HONOUR OF THE PRIME MINISTER.

Our compatriot, Mr. Gottfried Keller, President of the Foreign Press Association in London, was in the Chair at the Association's Dinner to the Prime Minister, the Rt. Hon. Clement R. Attlee, M.P., which took place on Wednesday, 1st November, at the Dorchester Hotel, Park Lane, W.1.

More than 400 members and guests were received by Mr. & Mrs. Keller previous to the dinner.

The Prime Minister's important speech was broadcast by the B.B.C. (Home Service) and has since received wide publicity in the Daily Press, so that no special mention need be made in our columns.

Mr. Gottfried Keller proposed the Toast to the guests, in a most brilliant manner, full of humour; his witty and short after-dinner speeches have become by now one of the chief attractions of the Foreign Press Association functions, and the compliments paid to him by the Prime Minister and subsequent speakers were fully deserved.

Important speeches on this occasion were also made by the Rt. Hon. Sir David Maxwell Fyfe, K.C., M.P., the Rt. Hon. Clement Davies, K.C., M.P. (Leader of the Liberal party) and the Rt. Hon. Sir Hartley Shawcross, Attorney General.
