Indeed such good attendance might have evoked not only gladness in some directorial breasts but also a justifiable expectation, having successfully discharged their duties during an eventful year, of a few extra Sundays relaxing with feet on the mantelpiece or buried in the depths of the ever recurring garden weeds. But as nothing succeeds like success, when it came to the point, the grateful members could not see their way to lifting the burden off such willing shoulders and with one exception, under the benign chairmanship of Mr. Vincenzo Ratti, voted the outgoing " Direzione " back into office by acclamation, as follows :

All present were introduced by the President to Dott. Guido Lepori, the newly arrived member of the Legation who responded to the address of welcome by Mr. Berti, by expressing his satisfaction at the opportunity of meeting so many of his "conterranei" within a week of his reaching his new post.

In closing we would congratulate Mr. Carlo Berti upon his re-election, and wish him the best of luck for his fourth term.
