The deceased was a fervent and faithful Swiss who retained his nationality to the end.

He was born in Richterswil (Ct. Zurich), in 1872, and came to this country in 1891. His early years in England were spent in London, where he served a number of years in completing his training as a hotel chef. Eventually he became the proprietor of the Seacrest Hotel, Seaford (Sussex).

It is with deep regret that we announce the death of Mr. G. A. Ochs, of Belltrees Grove, S.W.16.

The deceased, who was well-known in the Swiss Colony, was born in Basle in 1890, where he received his schooling.

After an apprenticeship in his native town he obtained a position with the CIBA in Italy, with which concern he remained for three years.

In 1912, he came to this country where he occupied a post with the Clayton Anilin Company in Manchester. Later on he started his own business.

Mr. Ochs came to London in 1919 and carried on his own business with great success. He was a member of the Institute of British Engineers.
