Amongst the numerous Swiss Societies in London is the Swiss Male Choir; a Society, it is true, which does not advertise itself much, but every year they give a concert, just to prove that they are a lively and going concern.

Our Male Choir is always ready to render a helping hand at several functions arranged by the Swiss Club (Schweizerbund) and has become one of the star turns

at the annual "Fête Suisse."

It would be wrong to say that their collaboration has not received due appreciation, as many members of the Swiss Colony, have, on various occasions, either privately or publicly expressed their pride that the Colony should have such an excellent Choir. Ritzmann, 99, Gresham Street, E.C.2, or from the members of the Swiss Male Choir, but it is urged that early booking is essential in order not to be disappointed.

The programme is a very varied one and I am really pleased to hear that Miss Ruth Huggenberg has kindly consented to take part in this Concert, who, at previous concerts and with her recitals, has endeared herself to the Swiss Colony. The "Zürcher Jodler" will bring us our lovely songs from the Homeland, fresh, lively songs and nostalgic ones and our own Male Choir will give us a taste of what it means to take part in a competition by singing to us the test piece set them by the Wembley Music Festival of 1950: namely "Landerkennung", a Norwegian Saga set to

music by Grieg. It is a programme which studies all tastes.

There is thus no excuse for not booking this evening and to turn up in large numbers on Wednesday, April 3rd next at Queen Mary Hall; I have not the slightest doubt that it will be an evening well spent.
