Dear Friend,

The Swiss Church in London, as you know, consists of two parishes, the "Eglise Suisse" for the French speaking and the "Schweizerkirche" for the German speaking Swiss. Whilst the Consistoire, who is in charge of both parishes, some years ago purchased a house to accommodate the Minister and his family of the French speaking congregation, so far no such accommodation has been available for the German-Swiss Minister and his family. For some time past the Consistoire has realised the necessity of acquiring a suitable house for this purpose, but unfortunately our resources have not allowed us to proceed with the project so far.

The fact that the Minister of our German speaking congregation, as a result of a call which he has accepted, will be returning to Switzerland at the beginning of next year, has now made it of great urgency that we should find accommodation for his successor and family.

As a result of a most attractive offer just received, we venture to approach our friends here and in Switzerland with a request for their kindly assistance in the realisation of our plan. The house offered to us is freehold, in good condition and at present available at the very attractive price of £2,500. Similar property in these days is changing hands at considerably higher figures.

We do not find it easy to make this appeal, well knowing the heavy financial burdens which everyone has to bear in these abnormal times, but we feel that we should make every effort not to let this unique opportunity pass without taking advantage of it.
