# FAREWELL LUNCHEON of Dr. A. R. LINDT, COUNSELLOR OF LEGATION.

Previous to his departure, Dr. A. R. Lindt, Press Counsellor at the Swiss Legation, gave a fare-well luncheon to London correspondents of Swiss Agencies, Radio Organisations and Newspapers, on Wednesday, February 25th, at the Dorchester Hotel, Park Lane, W.1.

To bid farewell to a man one has become genuinely fond of always brings a twinge of sadness, but it was common knowledge, that sooner or later our friend would leave us, and we were prepared and spared from a shock.

With almost monotonous regularity members of the diplomatic staff of our Legation in London, are departing, either to return to the Foreign Office in Berne, or to other posts in various corners of the globe; bonds of friendship made up for a relatively short period are thus rudely interrupted, and all that is left to us are pleasant memories.


