Flood Distress Fund Result

£450.1.11

On Monday, March 23rd, the Swiss Minister, Monsieur Henry de Torrenté, called at the Mansion House, and handed over to the Lord Mayor a cheque amounting to £450.1.11 being the result of the Appeal made by the Assembly of Presidents of Swiss Societies in Great Britain, and published in this paper on February 13th, and 27th, 1953.
