FREDERICK WYSS †.

We deeply regret to announce the death of Mr. Frederick Wyss, which occurred on July 29th, at the Blackbrook Hospital, Kidderminster, at the age of 67.

The deceased was at one time Chef at the Carlton Hotel, London, and at various Hotels in the Midlands. For some time he was Steward at the "Schweizerbund", 74, Charlotte Street, W.1. On leaving the last mentioned appointment he became Proprietor of the Black Swan Hotel, Birmingham, the Crown and Sandys Hotel, Ombersley, and Valentia Hotel, Arley, near Kidderminster.

Owing to illness, he retired to an Off License establishment in Kidderminster, where he had resided for the last three years.

Frederick Wyss was for over 30 years a member of the Swiss Club, Birmingham, and a member of the Lucullus Club, Old Compton Street, London, W.1.

He leaves a widow and a young daughter to whom we extend our deepest sympathy.

EDOUARD AUGUSTE BOUDRY †

We sincerely regret to announce the passing away, at St. Mary's Hospital, Paddington, on the 9th of this month, after a short illness, of Mr. Edouard Auguste Boudry, aged 80, of 4, Pembridge Place, London, W.C.2.

Mr. Boudry was a Vaudois from Concise his "commune d'origine", near Boudry on the lake of Neuchâtel, his ancestor's birth-place.

The departed was a well-known and eminent Hotelier both in London and the Provinces; amongst the various posts which he occupied during the last 40 years of his séjour in this country, were: Manager at the Savoy Hotel, London, under Reeves Smith (during the first world war), General Manager at the Midland Hotel, Birmingham, Manager of the Cadogan and the De Vere Hotels, London.

Mr. Boudry retired in 1942, after holding the post of General Catering Manager to the Duke of Sutherland at Trentham Gardens, Staffs., for seven years.

He leaves a widow and two sons (one of them is at present Manager of the Endcliffe Hotel, Cliftonville, Margate) to whom we extend our heart-felt sympathy in their loss.
