A DEPARTURE AT THE SWISS LEGATION.

Once again we have to announce a departure at the Swiss Legation, this time it is Colonel Paul Gygli, Military and Air Attaché, who is returning to Switzerland in order to take up the post as "Schulkommandant" (School of recruits) in Frauenfeld.

Colonel Gygli was born in 1909 at Langnau (Ct. Berne), and is a citizen of Utzenstorf (Berne). He attended schools at Berne and afterwards took up law studies at the University of that town, where he obtained the degree of doctor of law, before starting his military career as Instructor.

In 1941, he passed through the General Staff College, and during the last war he was in command of various units. Colonel Gygli was appointed Chief of Staff of the 8th Division in 1950, with the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel. Two years later (1952), he succeeded Colonel J. G. Rieser as Military and Air Attaché to the Swiss Legation in London; whilst here he was promoted to the rank of Colonel.

Both Colonel Gygli, and his charming wife have attended, during the last three years many social functions in the London Swiss Colony, where they were much liked. Their departure is much regretted, and we tender them our best wishes in their new sphere of activities.
