### SWISS PRO JUVENTUTE STAMP ISSUE.

This year the annual set of Pro Juventute stamps for Switzerland will be issued on December 1st. Of the charity premium, 90 per cent. of the net proceeds will go to the Pro Juventute Foundation. Three-fifths of the remaining 10 per cent. is intended for the improvement of the school dental service in the mountains, and two-fifths for hygiene instruction in schools and training colleges.

The 5c. value is dedicated to the famous Ticino architect, Carlo Moderno (1556-1629) of Capolago, and shows a portrait with the church of Sant Andrea della Valle in Rome in the background.

The remaining values continue the previous series of butterflies, moths and insects.

The 10c. value depicts the Burnet Moth and will be coloured green, red and dark green; the 20c. shows a Purple Emperor butterfly in red brown, violet and yellow; the 30c. design is of a Blue Ground Beetle and colours are yellow, light blue and dark blue; and the top value 40c. depicts a Large White butterfly and will be coloured blue, brown and yellow.

The 5c. value will be engraved by Karl Bickel, after a painting in the Museo Civico at Lugano and the pictorial designs are by Niklaus Stoecklin of Riehen.

Messrs. Courvoisier have been chosen to print the insect designs by the photogravure process, and the low value will be rotary line engraved at the Post Office Printing Office at Berne.

In addition to the stamps themselves, special firstday covers cancelled with the Pro Juventute cancellation will be available, as also the usual collection sheets and folders.

This year the Pro Juventute Foundation has requested the Post Office to issue certain of the values in a special stamp booklet. This will be on sale containing 12 of the 5c., 12 of the 10c. and 4 of the 20c. values.
