The “Home” is open all the year round. Apply to the Consulate for a prospectus, or write direct to: The Secretary, “Home” for Swiss Nationals Living Abroad, Dürrenäsch (Aargau, Switzerland).

A “Home” for every Swiss National Living Abroad. Guests of the “Home” pay a nominal fee for board and lodging of 5.— to 10.— Sfr. in cash per day. The “Home” is run on “do-it-yourself” lines, and guests undertake to help in its running, whereas they are free to spend their leisure hours in any way they wish. Personal requests and supplementary services are charged at cost price.

1. Courses at the “Home”

- Children are admitted to attend a Swiss day school
- Courses in languages, technical subjects, citizenship, etc.
- Housekeeping and cookery lessons
- Professional advice and employment bureau
- Exploratory and sporting excursions
- Advice bureau for Swiss students from abroad and “stagiaires”
- Lectures, conferences, meetings, etc.
