REPATRIATION OF SWISS FROM THE CONGO

A Swissair machine has arrived at the Cointrin airport from Brazzaville with seventy-one Swiss nationals, mostly mothers and children. Another Swissair machine landed at Kloten airport, also from Brazzaville, with fifty-six Swiss passengers.

A communiqué from the Federal Political Department states that all Swiss in Leopoldville, Stanleyville, Albertville and Inga are safe and well.

1st OF AUGUST CELEBRATION

NOUVELLE SOCIETE HELVETIQUE (London Group)

On Wednesday, 13th July, the President of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique, on behalf of the Council, entertained to luncheon at The Dorchester, Monsieur Gerard Bauer, ancien Ministre, President de la Federation Suisse des Associations de Fabricants d'Horlogerie. Mons. Bauer subsequently addressed a small gathering of compatriots, led by H.E. the Swiss Ambassador and drawn largely from the watchmaking industry, on the very topical subject of "Integration européenne et l'horlogerie Suisse", and outlined in brilliant manner the steps contemplated by the Swiss Watchmaking Industry in their endeavours to deal with marketing conditions in the common market countries on one hand and world markets in general.

Mons. Bauer's vivid exposé was much applauded by those present and was followed by a general discussion which shed much further light on this very important problem.

It was generally felt that such personal contacts between leading members of the Swiss Industry and the Swiss Colony in London are highly commendable and much appreciated.
