The Federal Council has appointed Monsieur André Parodi, at present Swiss Ambassador to the Republics of Colombia and Esuador, to the post of Swiss Minister to the Republic of Czecho-Slovakia.

Ambassador Parodi was born in 1909 at Cairo, and is a citizen of Geneva. He studied Political Science at the Universities of Geneva, Baltimore, Exeter and Fribourg i.Br. He entered the service of the Federal Economic Department in 1932, and changed over to the Political Department in 1945, when he was transferred to the then Swiss Legation in Rome with the rank of 1st Secretary of Legation; two years later (1947) he was promoted to the rank of Counsellor of Legation. From 1954 to 1956 Monsieur Parodi occupied the post of Chargé d'Affaires at Bucharest. In 1956 he was nominated Swiss Minister to Colombia and Ecuador with residence in Bogota, and when the Legation was raised to the status of an Embassy he received Ambassadorial rank.

Dr. Hans Adolf Berger, Swiss Ambassador to Peru, and Swiss Minister to Bolivia, has vacated his post on reaching retiring age. He was born in 1895 and is a citizen of Langnau (Ct. Berne). In 1922 Dr. Berger joined the Swiss Consulate in Lima; ten years later (1932) he was promoted to the rank of Vice-Consul, and in 1946 to Consul. The following year the Federal Council asked him to open a Legation in that town in the capacity of Chargé d'Affaires. The same year he was accredited to Bolivia. In 1954 Dr. Berger was nominated Minister Plenipotentiary to the two countries with residence at Lima. When in 1957 the Legation was raised to an Embassy he received Ambassadorial rank.

Dr. Paul Frei, hitherto Swiss Consul in Düsseldorf, has been appointed Consul-General in Hamburg, in succession to Mr. Paul Hochstrasser, who on reaching retiring age has vacated his post. Mr. René Cuttat, hitherto administrator of the Consulate-General in La Paz, has been nominated Swiss Consul in Düsseldorf.

Dr. Frei was born in 1905 and hails from St. Gall. He entered the service of the Federal Political Department in 1929, and held successively posts at Dijon and Munich. He was appointed Consul at Düsseldorf in 1951.

Mr. R. Cuttat was born in 1910 and is a citizen of Rossemaison. Entering the service of the Political Department in 1931, he held successively posts in Besançon, Paris, Strasbourg, Lyons and Ankara. After a two-year stay in Berne he was transferred to La Paz in 1954.

The Federal Council has conferred the title of Consul-General upon Mr. Jean Studer, Swiss Consul in Strasbourg.
