On the eve of "Vaticanum II" the bells of all Roman Catholic churches in Switzerland pealed for ten minutes. Solemn Masses were held and other church services during which prayers were said for the Council and for the renewal

of Christian Life.

The Federation of Swiss Protestant Churches (Schweizerischer Evangelischer Kirchenbund) issued a special prayer for the success of the Council and for the renascence of the Church, whose unity was at the moment still obscured.
