GOOD SKI-ING IN THE GLACIER REGIONS

The very heavy falls of snow that occurred during the winter and spring have created unusually good conditions for summer ski-ing on the snow and ice fields of the Swiss Alps. Crowds of ski-ing enthusiasts, with the aid of seasoned mountain flyers, will spend the summer or autumn touring the vast expanses of snow to be found throughout the higher regions of the Alps. The experts add a word of caution: it is becoming increasingly clear that the ease with which the altitudes of perpetual snow may now be reached has engendered a somewhat lackadaisical attitude to the need for proper equipment; even in fine weather the high mountains are not without their hazards, and a rucksack with food and other necessaries, together with suitable warm clothing, are essential.
