##### London Group

On 18th June, the Council of the London Group of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique elected its officers. Dr. H. W. Egli remains President, Mr. M. Schneebeli retired as Vice-President, and Mr. P. Bessire has taken his place, Mr. L. S. R. Asch remains Hon. Treasurer and Mr. P. Bringolf Hon. Secretary. According to the constitution, a fifth member of the Executive Committee was elected in the person of Mrs. W. Meier.

On 23rd June, the N.S.H. held an Open Meeting at which questions of interest to the Swiss Colony were discussed, viz., the Swiss Cultural and Social Centre which may at last become a reality, and the proposed Constitutional Article regarding the Swiss abroad.

Anyone of Swiss nationality may join the London Group of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique. The membership fee is 25/- p.a. The N.S.H. organises Open Meetings usually once a month (except during the summer holiday period), and these are held at the Swiss Hostel for Girls in Hampstead. Lectures and talks in French, German or English are given on a variety of subjects of a cultural, artistic, educational, economic or political character, mainly concerning Switzerland.
