A BIG FACTORY IN A LITTLE CANTON

The Canton of Zug is the smallest in Switzerland, but it contains the biggest electrical appliances factory in the country, Landis & Gyr, which at the beginning of the century manufactured no more than a few hundred appliances a year with a staff of only thirty-five. But as time passed and the firm grew, the rate of production speeded up so that the firm, which now has 5,700 workers (over double this number if those employed by the firm abroad, in Europe and overseas, are added) recently produced its 30 millionth electrical appliance. The apparatus in question was a centralized remote control receiver, the latest item in a big order from the electricity department of the town of Invercargill, in New Zealand.

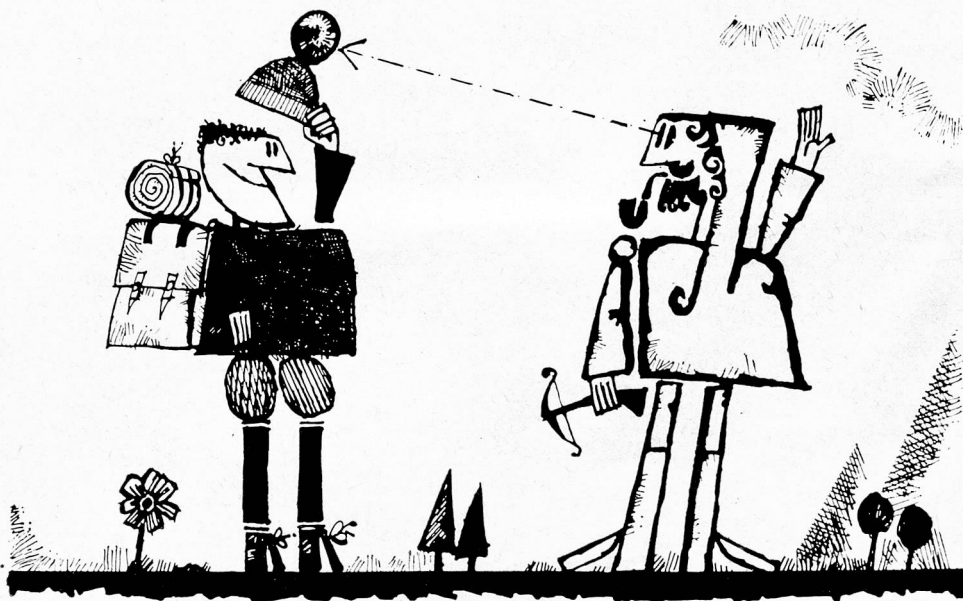

ORCHIDS IN THE BERNESE OBERLAND

In the immediate vicinity of Kandersteg, some thirty types of wild orchid and two or three dozen other rare Alpine plants bloom from about mid-May until far into the Summer. Mountain-guide Hermann Ogi, who is also an amateur botanist, ranks as the leading expert and protector of this Alpine flora. He has been observing, studying and tending his beloved plants for fifteen years, and seeing to it that every Spring those which grow too near the resort town's popular walking paths are clearly marked. According to the latest count of the orchid types, there has been an annual increase among them of about 100 plants. There are now some 1,146 examples of the rare lady-slipper, for example. The Gastern Valley is particularly interesting, botanically speaking. In it there are plants and flowers the seeds and spores of which have been carried by the wind, or by flocks of sheep, over the Alpine passes from the south, resulting in some fascinating and unique hybrids. These unusual Alpine plants are protected, of course. For enthusiasts who can restrain their plucking instincts, the Kandersteg Tourist Office organizes regular botanical excursions under the knowledgeable guidance of Hermann Ogi.
