NEW SPORTS CENTRE

Villars-Tiercelin (2,850 ft.) in the Lake Geneva region, is due to become the location of a privately-sponsored sports centre modelled after the previously unique facility at Magglingen. Among the planned facilities is a football pitch with 4-lane running track, facilities for all kinds of athletic activities (with emphasis on discus and javelin throwing and jumping), plus a 60-room hotel or dormitory, including dining facilities, massage rooms, and a kitchen to cater for 1,000 people. An artificial ice rink will extend the centre's usefulness during the winter months.

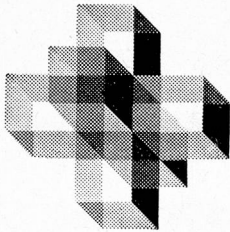
SELF-SERVICE STORES IN SWITZERLAND

At the end of 1965, there were in Switzerland 1,706 self-service food stores per million inhabitants, 1,061 of which had adopted the system partially and 645 completely. In Europe this proportion is bettered only by Sweden, Norway and West Germany. Complete self-service has been adopted mainly by the big chain stores, which accounted for 3,797 self-service stores in Switzerland at the beginning of the year as opposed to 3,429 the previous year. Partial self-service, which is generally preferred by independent tradesmen, was adopted in 5,867 stores at the beginning of this year as opposed to 5,547 twelve months earlier. Retail food stores in Switzerland total approximately 20,000.
