SWISSAIR DC-9 JETS TO FLY LONDON-SWITZERLAND

On 8th July 1966, Swissair will introduce new Douglas DC-9 jets on London-Basle-Zurich day flights and on 15th July on London-Zurich night flights. The airline will thus be the first to operate DC-9s into London on scheduled services. They will replace Convair Metropolitan and Caravelles.

In view of night jet restrictions at London (Heathrow) Airport, Swissair's advance summer timetable effective from 1st April 1966, provides for night tourist services to Geneva and Zurich to be run from London (Gatwick) Airport, while night flights to Basle will continue to use Heathrow. The precise periods of night jet operations at Heathrow and Gatwick are still under consideration in the light of the number of night jet movements authorised at Heathrow. All schedules are subject to government approval.

From 15th July Caravelles will replace F-27s on night flights to Basle from Heathrow. At the same time the route will be extended to Zurich to provide connections to the latter destination for night tourist passengers from the provinces. Also from that date, Swissair's U.K. operations will be flown entirely by jet.

Elsewhere, Swissair's summer programme continues to provide daily morning and evening departures from London to Zurich by four-engined Coronado jets and a daily afternoon Caravelle service to Geneva. From Manchester up to three direct night tourist services weekly will again be flown to Basle and Zurich by Coronado jets.

U.K.-Switzerland air fares remain unchanged next summer, ranging upwards from £21 19s. 0d. midweek night tourist return from London to Basle or Geneva.

Swissair will operate its DC-9s in a 75-seat all-tourist configuration, with five abreast seating. Cruising speed of the rear-engined twin-jet will be 560 m.p.h., giving an average flying time to Switzerland of a little over one hour.
