INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION OF TAPESTRY IN LAUSANNE

The International Centre of Ancient and Modern Tapestry (ICAMT) was founded in the town of Lausanne five years ago. At the same time, at the instigation and under the guidance of the famous artist and tapestrymaker Jean Lurçat, the first International Biennial of Tapestry was held at the Cantonal Museum of Fine Arts in Lausanne, where it met right away with world-wide success, attracting to Lausanne the tapestry makers of seventeen countries. The second Biennial was held in 1965 and the third, which has just opened in Lausanne, will last until 1st October. This international artistic event presents some ninety tapestries, each covering a minimum area of 55 square feet by tapestry-artists from twenty-seven countries. In addition to works executed in the high- and low-wrap techniques, visitors to this year's exhibition will see other techniques such as embroidery and *appliqué* work, as well as a number of experimental works.
