AN IMPORTANT REMINDER

The importance of this exhibition is underlined by the fact that Mr. Luc Boissonnas, Secretary-General of the "Pro Helvetia" Foundation, and Prof. E. Gradmann, Director of the Graphic Collection of the ETH, have come from Switzerland to be at the opening.

The exhibition will be reviewed in the next number of the "Swiss Observer". It will be open until 25th November.

SWISS WEEK IN THE CITY OF LONDON

From 9th to 15th November, a Swiss Week will be held at the Grillette Restaurant at Bucklersbury House, Walbrook, E.C.4. It is organised by Mecca Ltd. During that period, Swiss type dishes and Swiss wines will be available at lunch time, Swiss goods will be on display, and the Week will be opened by a Press Reception and Dinner on Wednesday, 8th November at the Cotillion Restaurant in the same building. Miss Switzerland (Miss Edith Fraefel) will be present, and there will be some Swiss music and other entertainment. The organisers are assisted by Swissair, Swiss National Tourist Office and by six suppliers of Swiss wines and provisions. The Swiss Embassy will be represented by the Press Attaché.

In the price of the tickets (4 gns.) are included a *Vin d'Honneur* (Féchy) served with *Chäschüechli* and *Schabzieger*, a five-course dinner (*charcuterie Suisse, Suppentopf*, veal, noodles and vegetables, baked apples and cream, coffee, Swiss cheeses, *petits fours*," "Johannisberger Riesling", "Dôle de Sion", "Rosamor", "Kirsch" and "Williamine".
